

METHODIST COLLEGE BELFAST AWARDS FOR ACHIEVEMENT IN SPORT

The following may be awarded to pupils participating in sports organised and coached within school: **Junior Colours, Colours, Honours and Special Award.**

The purpose of these awards is to recognise participation, commitment and achievement at an exceptionally high level in Methodist College sport.

In addition the **Ambassador Award** may be awarded to pupils participating in a sport not available and coached in the College.

All the awards contribute to the promotion of an ethos of achievement in which hard work, application and excellence are recognised, valued and rewarded.

The pupils who achieve these awards have shown sustained, exemplary and exceptional commitment to the ethos and values of the College that promote:

- the development of talent and ambition
- the pursuit of excellence
- respect of self and others
- equality of opportunity and inclusion
- courage, determination and inspiration

SPORTS AWARDS PROCESS

SPORTS AWARDS COMMITTEE

Members: The Sports Award Committee to consist of a Vice-Principal, the PE Department and members of staff in charge of a particular sport. (If the TIC is unavailable he/she can nominate a replacement to propose awards). The quorum for the committee is 5.

Chair: A Vice-Principal

Secretary: Head of PE

Meetings: Committee to meet twice yearly for the purpose of discussing and approving awards (March and June). The secretary to give at least 7 days' notice of a Sports Award meeting although it may also be necessary to call ad hoc meetings e.g. to approve Special Awards and Rowing awards (September). A minute will be kept of the decisions of the Committee.

Presentation: Awards will be made where possible prior to the Easter and Summer holidays and recipients names posted at the Sports Hall noticeboard. N.B. Rowing awards are normally announced in the autumn term due to the nature of the sporting calendar. The Chair to arrange where feasible for awards to be read out/presented in the appropriate assembly.

Appeals: An appeal against the application of the award criteria should be made to the Chair and the Sports Awards Committee re-convened if required.

COLLEGE AMBASSADOR AWARD (This has been moved from the middle of the document)

The College Ambassador award recognises **outstanding** ability **and exceptional** achievement by a pupil in a sport or activity **not** available in the College. This award is the equivalent of a Special Award and therefore will only be awarded to those whose achievements have a significant and far-reaching impact. Given the exceptionally high level of achievement and representation required for an Ambassador Award, it is likely that recipients will be in the Senior School.

The recipient will receive a Silver Wreath and Blue Maltese Cross lapel badge inscribed with the word Ambassador

COLLEGE AMBASSADOR AWARD COMMITTEE

Chair: Senior Vice-Principal

Members: 2 VPs and 2 APTs

Quorum: 3 (including the Chair).

Meetings: 3 days' notice of ad hoc meetings will be given to members by the Chair.
A minute will be kept of the decisions of the Committee.

Nominations: Nominations should be made in writing to the Senior Vice-Principal. The Committee will consult with appropriate member of staff before decision is made.

Appeals: An appeal against the application of the award criteria should be made to the Principal and a Member of the Board of Governors.

Presentation: The Chair will arrange for awards to be presented in main assembly in front of the appropriate year groups.
